Complete the online application or you can complete the entire process in person at an application center. Schedule an appointment online or call (855) 347-8371 weekdays, 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. ET. Walk-ins are welcome but appointments take priority.

Visit a TWIC application center to:

- Provide required documentation, be fingerprinted and take a facial photo. Bring your current U.S. passport or a driver's license and birth certificate.
- Pay a non-refundable fee valid for five years with a credit card, money order, company check or certified/cashier's check.
- New applicant: \$125.25
- New applicant reduced rate: \$93.00*
- In-Person renewal: \$125.25
- Online renewal: \$117.25
- Replacement card: \$60.00

You can have your card mailed to your home address or you can pick it up at the application center. You can check your status online at any time.

To be eligible for the reduced rate you must present a valid driver license with a hazardous materials endorsement, or a Free and Secure Trade card. Please note, if you select the reduced rate, your new TWIC card will be valid for five years from the chosen document's issuance date.

MMC Application Process

For an entry-level OS Credential, you will need to first get your Transportation Workers Identification Card (TWIC). Once you have received that you can then apply for your Merchant Mariner Credential (MMC).

- 1. After you receive your TWIC card you will then need to:
 - Complete Drug test using US Coast Guard Form 719P (Periodic Drug Testing Form)
 - Complete a physical using US Coast Guard Form 719K (Application for Merchant Mariner Credential)

Once these are completed you will then need to send the completed 719K form to **MEDAIP@uscg.mil** This will need to be sent in PDF format and you will need to include your full name and Social Security Number in the subject line.

- 2. The next step would be to:
 - Complete US Coast Guard Form 719B and US Coast Guard Form 719C (if applicable)
 - Pay fees through Pay.Gov

Once these forms have been completed there are a couple of ways that you can submit the forms to the US Coast Guard for processing. You can:

- Bring the completed forms along with your Drug Test results to the Jackson Federal Building, 912 2nd Ave, Room 194, Seattle, WA 98174-1067, at this time you will be administered the Mariner Oath by a member of the US Coast Guard, or
- Send completed forms along with your Drug Test results and a notarized copy of the Mariner Oath **in PDF format** to: RecSeattle@uscg.mil
