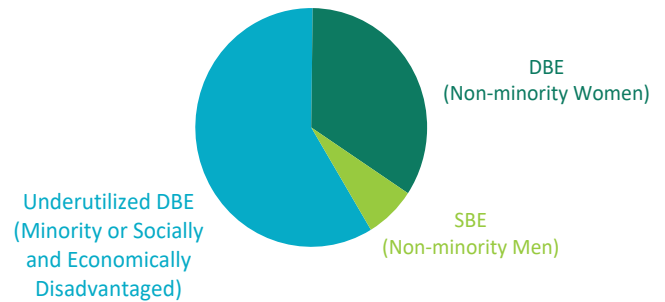

The Washington State Department of Transportation will be setting enforceable Federal Small Business Enterprise (FSBE) goals on projects not having UDBE goals. The purpose of FSBE goals is to eliminate barriers for small businesses participation as authorized by 49 Code of Federal Regulations § 26.39.

CERTIFICATIONS THAT CAN FULFILL THE FSBE GOAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Small Business Enterprises (must be certified by OMWBE)
- Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (including UDBEs)
