Night work along SR 520 at Bellevue Way

Construction crews need to work at night to complete work near the SR 520 eastbound off-ramp to Bellevue Way and the Bellevue Way overpass over SR 520. The work must be done at night to keep traffic moving during the day. Work will continue for three weeks or until complete.

Here are the details of the work:

- **When:** Nighttime shifts, 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday through Friday, beginning May 6 for three weeks or until complete.
- **Where:** Eastbound SR 520 between 92nd Avenue Northeast and Bellevue Way.

Crews will install:

- Drainage on the Bellevue Way overpass over SR 520.
- Panels and backfill east of the overpass, along the south side of SR 520.
- Interior diaphragms for the Bellevue Way bridge overpass.
- Water irrigation on Bellevue Way bridge overpass.



What you can expect:

- Neighbors can expect nighttime noise from trucks and equipment including excavators, compactors and a backhoe.
