

Engine Room Training Scholarship

About Our Program

Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) Engine Room Training Scholarships are managed through the Office of Equity and Civil Rights. This funding supports efforts to diversify the workforce at Washington State Ferries (WSF) by covering the costs of required credentials for entry-level positions on WSF vessels.

This scholarship is to be used for tuition for a Qualified Member of the Engine Department (QMED) training program only.

To Qualify

1. Fully complete the application. Incomplete applications may be rejected.
2. Be a Washington State Resident.
3. Indicate in your application any financial barriers or life hardships that have prevented you from enrolling in training or gaining effective employment.
4. Show QMED training enrollment (or show communication with the maritime training entity you plan to enroll in)
5. Be a Transportation Worker Identification Card (TWIC) holder
6. Have a Merchant Mariner Credential (MMC) (or can show you have applied for it)

To Apply

1. Complete both pages of the application.
2. Email the application and proof of enrollment (or communication with school) to maritimetradeprep@wsdot.wa.gov

What to Expect

- We will review your application once received and typically respond within 14 days to inform you of a decision.
- WSDOT will pay the training organization directly once we receive an invoice.
