The following Certification of Materials Origin is made for the purposes of establishing materials acceptance under Contract Provisions entitled "Build America, Buy America (BABA)" or "Buy America Requirements". Materials installed for the Estimate Number above are furnished for use in compliance with the certification as noted in 1, 2, or 3 below. **For certification of steel or iron products use DOT form 350-109.**

1. The Manufactured Products and Construction Materials covered by this certification are American Made. To be considered American Made, Manufactured Products must have been manufactured (final assembly) in the United States, and Construction Materials must have had all manufacturing processes occur entirely within the United State of America.
2. No Manufactured Products or Construction Materials were installed for the Estimate Number noted above.
3. The Manufactured Products and Construction Materials furnished for this project under this certification contain foreign Manufactured Products or foreign Construction Materials, as indicated below:

**Construction Materials must have all manufacturing processes occur in the United States and Manufactured Products must be manufactured (final assembly) in the United States or the material must be listed on this form as a foreign-made material.**

**The following items are defined as Construction Materials:**

1. Non-ferrous metals;
2. Plastic and polymer-based products (including polyvinylchloride, composite building materials, and polymers used in fiber optic cables)
3. Glass (including optic glass)
4. Fiber optic cable (including drop cable)
5. Optical fiber
6. Lumber
7. Drywall
8. Engineered wood

**A Manufactured Product includes any item produced as a result of the manufacturing process. Items that should be classified as a Manufactured Product (rather than a Construction Material) are:**

1. Items that consist of two or more of the listed Construction Materials that have been combined together through a manufacturing process,
2. Items that include at least one of the listed Construction Materials as defined above, combined with a material that is not listed through a manufacturing process.
3. Items that are not an Iron or Steel Product, a Construction Material, or an Excluded Material.

**Manufactured Products that include iron or steel.**

The iron or steel in a Manufactured Product must be tracked separately as an Iron or Steel Product using WSDOT Form 350-109 when:

1. A precast concrete product is classified as a Manufactured Product and the cost of the iron or steel exceeds 50 percent of the total cost of its total components
2. The cabinet or other enclosure of an intelligent transportation system or other electronic hardware systems classified as a Manufactured Product and the cost of the iron or steel exceeds 50 percent of the total cost of its total components

*These items must meet the requirements for and be tracked as a Manufactured Product and an Iron and Steel Product.*

**The following are classified as Excluded Materials and do not require a Certification of Materials Origin:**

1. Aggregates, to include cement and cementitious materials, aggregates such as stone, sand, or gravel or aggregate binding agents or additives and any combination of these materials when delivered to the work site without final form for incorporation into the project (i.e. wet concrete and HMA) If they are formed prior to delivery, they are a Manufactured Product and not an Excluded Material.
2. Temporary materials that are not being permanently incorporated into the project.
3. Raw or minimal processed materials that do not fall into any of the defined categories, as it is not a Manufactured Product, an Iron or Steel Product, or a Construction Material and when these materials are delivered to the work site without final form (i.e. seed mix and topsoil). If they are formed prior to delivery and are not an Iron or Steel Product or a Construction Material, they are a Manufactured Product and not an Excluded Material.
