The following courses can be accessed through WSDOT's LMS. From the intranet homepage, click on the LMS (training) link under the Hot Links on the right side of the page. ## Determining Requirements by Listening to the Voice of the Customer in Six Sigma

Customers are at the heart of all Six Sigma initiatives, and this focus on customers is what makes Six Sigma an outstanding organizational performance improvement program. It discusses some common customer data collection methods – such as surveys, interviews, and focus groups – and looks at how to ensure validity and reliability in data collection. In addition, the course illustrates how tools such as CTx, SIPOC, Kano analysis, critical-to-quality (CTQ) analysis, and quality function deployment (QFD) are used to translate customer data into critical customer requirements and actionable goals for the Six Sigma team. This course is aligned with the ASQ Certified Six Sigma Black Belt certification exam and is designed to assist learners as part of their exam preparation. It builds on foundational knowledge that is taught in SkillsSoft's ASQ-aligned Green Belt.

## No Right of Way Verification & Sufficient Property Rights (Flow Chart) Training

The new eLearning for No ROW Verification is available through the Right of Way Training and Education [website](#). This training is required for those responsible for making decisions on whether a federally funded local agency project has ROW needs, and for those completing the Design Approval Documentation form (Local Agency Guidelines Manual-Appendix 43.62). This training focuses on the process of reviewing the PS&E to verify a no ROW determination. The training also covers Property Rights or Interest flowchart and the Type of Property Rights Necessary flowchart to aid your agency in making clear and consistent property related decisions.

### Context Modal Accommodation Report (CMAR)

Context information is useful in an examination of tradeoffs involved in designing for the needs of all roadway users. Because the Basis of Design (BOD) requires an examination of context in order to determine modal priority, the Context and Modal Accommodation Report (CMAR) has been developed to help you walk through the guidance associated with context identification and other guidance published in Design Manual Chapters 1102 and 1103.

Context and Modal Accommodation report training walks you through the step by step process, the data sources, and the tools you'll need to complete a CMAR. This four hour training provides an overview, detailed instructions, and a real world example. By the end of the course you'll be prepared to fill out your own CMAR, or be a confident reviewer of a CMAR that's been developed for you. Contact [Mark Gabel](#) for details.
