What will it be like?

- 1. The Design Academy experience includes virtual pre-academy classes, in person interactive sessions, and a team project that will be shared at the end. This will allow students to gain base knowledge, to interact with the subjects, and demonstrate learning through discovery and experience. The team project encourages freedom and creativity in design.
- 2. Students will be assigned a team and a real WSDOT project location prior to the academy. Students will work on this project throughout the academy incorporating knowledge from the classes and sessions. There will be a virtual meet and greet before the academy, 8 hours working time during the academy, and an open house for teams to present their project at the end.
