



# Washington State Ferries Transport Form for Damaged Hybrid, Electric, and Alternative Energy Vehicles (EV).

Damaged alternative-energy vehicles, whether driven or towed, may not board without the following form. The completed form must be submitted to Washington State Ferries staff upon arrival to the terminal. Vehicles attempting to transit without the form will be denied passage.
